U.S. Coast Guard Pipe Band participates in the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial 2012 events in Washington, D.C.

As the premiere maritime law enforcement agency in the United States, we sometimes forget that the United States Coast Guard shares the same excitement, and dangers, with other State, Local, and Federal law enforcement officers. 14 Coast Guard shipmates paid the ultimate sacrifice and are forever remembered at the National Law Enforcement Memorial in Washington, DC. For this reason, and with the great assistance of D8 WR Coordinator Dan Jackson (also a member of the St. Louis County Police Department Pipes & Drums and our event intel guy), CDR Warren Whitley, Senior Chief Steve Cochran, and LT Mike Doria, your USCG Pipe Band participated for the first time in the Police Week events.

As a first time event for the USCGPB, turnout was exceptional with 20 members of the band taking time to travel and represent the Coast Guard. Monday, 14 May dawned cloudy with light to moderate rain, but the rain stopped long enough for the Pipe Major M.L. Loudermilk to lead the USCGPB in the Honor Guard/Pipe Band competition (http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=fuKExOqBG-I&feature=youtu.be) where we took third place. Following a quick photo opportunity in front of the US Capitol building, the Band headed to perform for an enthusiast audience of over 100 at USCG Headquarters (HQ). All, of which, was completed by 1300. The Washington DC Police Department Fraternal Order of Police (FOP) sponsors a "tent city" with beer garden (of course), and various dealers with cop bling, patches, cigars, T-shirts, etc. and this year the location was moved from near Union Station to just north of USCG HQ on 2nd Street. So, not to pass up an opportunity to pipe, we marched into tent city and piped for the FOP crowd. The long day culminated in a huge parade with more than 15 pipe bands marching from near North Capitol Street and New Jersey to the Law Enforcement Memorial. At the Law Enforcement Memorial, this year's solemn remembrance was led by the New York City Police Department (NYPD) and the NYPD Emerald Society Pipe Band. Dedicated on October 15, 1991, the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial honors federal, state and local law enforcement officers who have made the ultimate sacrifice for the safety and protection of our nation and its people.

Recently started for the first time in the bands history is a quarterly Board of Directors (BoD) Conference Call. This has enabled Board Members to openly discuss new topics and challenges that require solid planning with a defined next step on a real time basis. Multiple topics have been engaged and the calls have lasted on average 2.5 hours.

Some of the topics include the following:

- Café Press / USCGPB Merchandise: A variety of Pipe Band merchandise is now available through the link on the Pipe Band Web Site. Part of the Proceeds will to Directly to the Band.

Solicitation for A New Quartermaster!

The U.S. Coast Guard pipe band is in need of a quartermaster and is soliciting applications of all Pipe Band members. Applicants should have the ability to prepare and maintain a concise inventory of all equipment and uniform items maintained by the USCG Pipe Band. This individual or individuals (if more than one is selected), must be willing to work with prior band members to recoup previously issued equipment and uniforms from those prior members. Applicants must also establish a strong working relationship with Alexis Malcolm (our kilt maker) to ensure that USCGPB kilts are manufactured for distribution to those members in need of one in a timely manner. Strong accounting skills are also needed in order to keep accurate records of all kilts distributed or shipped by Ms. Malcolm to individual members. Below is the official job description of the Quartermaster's duties. Please submit you applications to the Pipe Major, Mr. Andy Anderson.

Band Quartermaster: The Drum Major, as the Uniform Authority, with the advice and consent of the Board of Directors, shall appoint and oversee the Band Quartermaster. The Band Quartermaster must meet all qualifications to be a member of the Pipe Band but need not be a fully qualified piper or drummer. The Band Quartermaster shall be responsible for maintaining a close working relationship with the Drum Major with regard to the standard items and articles of Pipe Band uniforms, insignia and accoutrements as adopted by the Pipe Band, and, as appropriate, approved by the U. S. Coast Guard Pipe Band Uniform Regulations.

The Band Ouartermaster will identify and establish reliable and economic sources of quality vendors for the various items and articles of Pipe Band uniforms, insignia and equipment required to outfit and equip new and existing members. The Band Quartermaster will maintain a record of all items and articles of uniform, insignia and equipment acquired or purchased by the Pipe Band, ensure that it is appropriately marked, keep records of issuance upon written receipt and ensure their return from departing Band Members. The Band Quartermaster will maintain on hand an adequate inventory of high consumption or long lead-time items in order to ensure the ability to outfit new members or replace equipment with reasonable dispatch. The Band Quartermaster will perform such additional duties as the Drum Major may direct.

DO YOU KNOW...? CWO3 Michael Henry, USCG (Ret)

Michael Henry enlisted in the Coast Guard in 1978 and attended Basic Training at Training Center (TRACEN) Cape May, NJ. Soon thereafter, he attended Damage Controlman Class "A" School at Governors Island, NY. Michael advanced through the enlisted ranks up to Chief Petty Officer before accepting a Commission as a Chief Warrant Officer (CWO). Mr. Henry then retired from Active Duty in 2003 after obtaining the rank of CWO3. Mr. Henry's assignments included the USCGC HORNBEAM (WLB 304) in Cape May, NJ, TRACEN Governors Island, NY, CG Base Gloucester City, NJ, CG Electronics Engineering Center in Wildwood Crest, NJ, CG Group St. Petersburg, FL, CG Marine Safety Office (MSO) Valdez, AK, the USCGC GENTIAN (WLB 290) in Atlantic Beach, NC, CG Station Newport, OR, CG Civil Engineering Unit (CEU) Cleveland, OH, and CG Support Center Elizabeth City, NC.

Mr. Henry's piping career started in Seminole Florida in 1983 while assigned to CG Group St. Petersburg. Shortly thereafter, he was transferred to Alaska where there were no instructors to help keep his development on track, so aside from some self-tutoring, Mr. Henry went dormant until September of 2001. It was then that he saw CWO (Ret) Kevin Gilheany's post on Fred's Place and was motivated to once again to get back on track with my studies of the Great Highland Bagpipes. Mr. Henry resumed my lessons with Michael Crawley of the 87th Cleveland Pipe Band. Mr. Crawley, a grade 1 Piper and a Grade 1 Drummer, is currently the Pipe Major of the 87th Cleveland Pipe Band, a past Lead Drummer for the Great Lakes Grade II Pipe Band and also has his own Celtic Rock Band based out of Cleveland, Ohio called Mary's Lane. Mr. Crawley tutored Michael with the music to be played for the first appearance of Coast Guard Pipers in Grand Haven in August 2002.

After his debut appearance as a charter member and subsequent plank owner of the U.S. Coast Guard Pipe Band (USCGPB), Mr. Henry was transferred to Elizabeth City, NC where he continued his studies, working toward learning competition tunes for both grade IV and V. Upon Mr. Henry's retirement in 2003, he was inducted into the 87th Cleveland Pipe Band's Grade V competition Band, where he briefly competed as a solo piper. After two years in Grade V, Mr. Henry advanced to Grade IV and served as the Instructor for Grade V.

In an effort to hone his skills, Mr. Henry has attended work-shops with Mr. Robert Mathieson, former Pipe Major of The House of Edgar Shotts and Dykehead, as well as Mr. Robert Wallace, Principle of the College of Piping, Glasgow Scotland. In an effort to gain a better appreciation and understanding of the Ensemble required for successful competition Mr. Henry has attended workshops in London, Ontario Canada with world champion drummers Mike Cole (bass), Craig "Hoss" Colquhoun (bass), Jim Kilpatrick (snare), Tyler Fry and Scott Curie (Tenor). Mr. Henry continues to compete with the grade IV Band.

After serving as a Pipe Corporal for several years with the USCGPB, Mr. Henry was appointed as a Pipe Sergeant. He now currently serve as a member of the Board of Directors and fills the collateral positions Operations Officer, Webmaster and Regional Coordinator for the Ninth Coast Guard District.
